### **World Book Day**

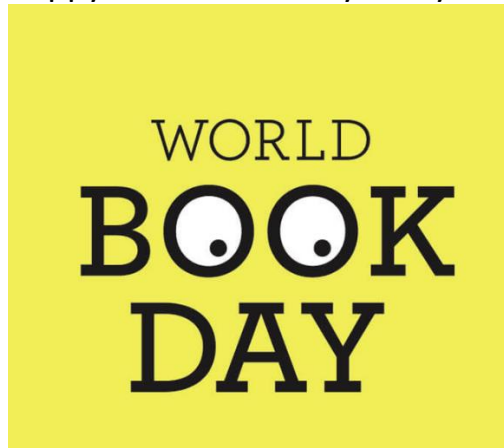
In two weeks, on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March, we will be celebrating World Book Day once again. We know that this can cause unnecessary stress and can be costly for parents and so we would like to try something different this year. If you have already sorted out a costume, or you love the fancy dress character tradition of World Book Day, the children are more than welcome to come in in a costume. However, we want to celebrate what good reading feels like, comfortable, warm and safe, and so on World Book Day, children can come to school in their comfiest, snuggliest reading clothes. This might be tracksuit bottoms and jumpers, big fluffy hoodies or even a dressing gown. The choice is yours! We do ask that you consider playtimes, which may be outside. Please make sure your children can dress warmly and if you want to wear your slippers, you bring a pair of outside shoes with you as well.
