

This half term Reception children have been looking at Branch 4 'Desert to Garden' in 'To know you more clearly'. We have been discovering what happened to Jesus during his time the desert.


We spoke in detail about Palm Sunday and the events that took place, even recreating it in class. We made palm leaves and waved them at 'Jesus' and his 'donkey' as they entered Jerusalem. We have decorated crosses as a symbol of Jesus and have added them to our class display. To end the topic we have been looking at the events of Holy Week.

YEAR 1

In their new 'To Know you More Clearly' work, Year 1 have been learning about the stories of Jesus teaching in the temple. We thought about what it made us wonder. We had lots of ideas:

'I wonder why people wanted to kill Jesus.' 'I wonder if Jesus loved the temple.' 'I wonder why they wanted to listen to Jesus.' 'I wonder what Jesus said.'

Year 1 also read the story of Jesus riding into Jerusalem. We talked about how all of the people might have reacted and what they might have said to each other and to Jesus.







In Come and See, we have been discussing different ways of giving and receiving thanks at school, at home and in the community, through special cards. We re-enacted the events of Palm Sunday, showing how people would have reacted to Jesus arriving in Jerusalem on a donkey.

When learning about Lent, we made promises, put them together into a paper chain and sang songs of praise. You can see some our pictures above, showing "Heaven and Earth in all God's glory".

We also enjoyed reading the Eucharistic Prayer this half term and talking about our favourite phrases of thanksgiving. We wrote our own prayers, giving thanks and praise for all of God's gifts.

YEAR 3





Our Come and See this half term has all been about preparing for Lent and the gifts we give and receive at this time of year.

We learnt about people in our community who have to face dangers and risks to give to us, fire officers, roofers, electricians, police officers, all who offer a service even though it could cause them harm. We thought about what that meant for us, and how we can give to our friends, family and wider community, through kindness, forgiveness and love, just as Jesus taught. We wrote these gifts on presents and decorated them for our loved ones.

We have also listened to the Beatitudes, a set of gifts from God, about ways He will bless our lives. If we are peacemakers, He will grant us peace, if we help those who are sad, we will be smiled upon by God. We wrote prayers, asking God for help to follow the Beatitudes and welcome his gifts, that we can then share with others.

YEAR 5




In 'Come and See' this half term Year 5 have been looking at the topic 'Memorial Sacrifice'.





The images show some of the children's lovely work, retelling the story of the Last Supper.


















EUCHARISTIC
